HAPPINESS AND OUR CREATOR

Recently I was reading a book to my daughter in which the main character, an elementary school age girl, has a father in prison and struggles with her mom to make a life for themselves in the projects. Their story unfolds as they find a way to focus on what they have – instead of what they don't.

She and her mom make a "wish list" of all the things they desire, but the little girl becomes sad because all the items are out of reach, they cannot afford them – a phone, a laptop computer. The mother senses her sadness and despair, and decides to shift the focus. The two of them make a list on their living room wall of all the things that are FREE that make them happy – hugs, snuggles, drawings.

As Catholics we have a number of tools in our toolbox that are FREE! These are keys to peace of mind and heart in a 24/7 noisy world that is constantly flooding us with ideas of what will make us "happy."

There can be no happiness apart from our Creator, and the tools to be in tune with our Heavenly Father are available to us each and every day. No matter where you are in your faith journey, as we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, it's time to think about ways to go deeper – and by doing so become Jesus' hands and feet in world full of Thomases.

Here are a few concrete ideas to help you, and your family today and every day!

DAILY PRAYER.

This is as easy as sipping your morning coffee/tea/water and asking the Blessed Mother to direct your path or ask Jesus to walk with you so you can be his hands and feet, voice and ears to all you encounter. Putting Jesus first in your day – asking Him and the Blessed Mother to guide you – will almost certainly bring you peace of mind and success in putting "first things first" as you juggle the demands of the day.

SUNDAY MASS.

Contrary to popular notion, Sunday Mass is not optional. Keeping Holy the Sabbath is one of the Ten Commandments! It's as important (more important really) than any sports activity for your child or professional sporting event. There are few simple things we are instructed to do directly by God, and this is at the top of the list! Modeling taking care of our soul is as important as worrying about the nutrition our kids eat. All of us can give God one hour a week.

RECONCILIATION.

The forgotten sacrament of our Catholic faith and what distinguishes us from other faiths: confession. Why is it important to your spiritual well-being? It is the radical weapon Jesus Christ brought to his public ministry that was revolutionary at a point in time when people offered things and money to have their sins forgiven!

Here Jesus makes people NEW – over and over in the Gospels, he sets people free in a spirit of love and mercy! None of us are perfect, all of us struggle with things that separate us from God and God's will in our lives (the definition of sin for ordinary people like me). Give yourself the gift of confession. Model it for your family, the peace of mind and heart that accompanies it is a great gift!

WEEKDAY MASS.

As Catholics, we are fortunate and blessed that we have the ability to receive Jesus in the Sacrament of the Eucharist every day of the week. Making the time to get to daily mass – or starting just once a week – is life changing. Especially if you juggle small children at Sunday Masses! Allow yourself to be nourished and cherished by our Heavenly Father. Sit in silence in a Church. Open your heart.

SERVICE.

Service to others is a cornerstone of our faith! Find a way to incorporate service into your family life! Whether at your parish, in your community – wherever – make the time to do what we are called to do!

FINALLY, BE KIND TO YOURSELF.

God always meets us where we are at! Don't fret about what you have not done in the past – just focus on what you can do different in the future! Sometimes I get caught up in how seemingly "perfect" or more engaged other Catholic families are. It's a humble reminder that we can learn from others if we allow ourselves to do so – we are all on a journey! We are all trying to go deeper and nothing pleases God more than that, I imagine. Making the effort to be with Him.

The Blessed Mother can be a powerful ally in your quest to know Jesus and our Heavenly Father more intimately! I turn to her frequently, especially when my sin seems to be a permanent wedge in my relationship with the Holy Trinity – she always gently welcomes me back and helps me find the courage to continue on – like any good Mother does for her children.
